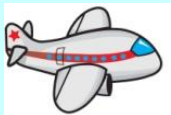
July 3-7

Registration: All classes have a limited enrollment and class sizes may fill up early. Early registration is advised. Registration is accepted on a first come, first served basis. Lunch: Students are required to bring their own lunch and drink each day.

Schedule: Monday - Friday, from 9:30 a.m - 2:30 p.m.
